The Flyway Festival celebrates the annual migration through the San Francisco Bay Estuary of more than 1 million shorebirds and hundreds of thousands of ducks, geese and hawks. If you have attended the Flyway Festival in the past, welcome back to our 14th annual party for our wild neighbors from the north. If this is the first time, we certainly welcome you!

This year, we bring you more of Mare Island in Pearl Jones Tranter's stunning photography collection recently shown at the Vallejo Naval and Historical Museum; walks on your own and guided history and nature hikes and outings throughout the island, in addition to photography classes.

Since many of our regional outings are normally closed to regular public access, the Festival has become a must-do for avid birders, hikers and outdoor enthusiasts. You won't be disappointed. A new guided walk is offered at Ellis Creek Wetland in Petaluma adjacent to popular Shollenberger Park; Napa River Adventures boat trips are back strong as always with Napa River wetland trips 2 days and a day at Lake Hennessey in northern Napa County. The King-Swett Ranches near Vallejo provide incredible raptor habitat and are truly precious gems in the Bay's crown. Antioch Dunes National Wildlife Refuge is home to rare endangered plants. Skaggs Island, a special place in our hearts, will return better than ever in 2011. In the meantime, visit Hudeman Slough or American Canyon wetlands. You will surely be thrilled.

As I work with our volunteers, exhibitors and sponsors to bring you this wonderful celebration, I'm reminded of a special place I go to often for inspiration, so beautifully captured in Brian Collett's photo. Looking west, south, east and north on our sacred sentinel hill atop Mare Island, one really does experience the lure of the Bay with its invitation to songbirds and shorebirds, waterfowl and raptors, too, to stop off, refuel, restore, and continue in flight or stay a while, on their journey south along the Pacific Flyway.

I hope you find your own place of joy on the wild side of San Francisco Bay and its watershed this weekend.
